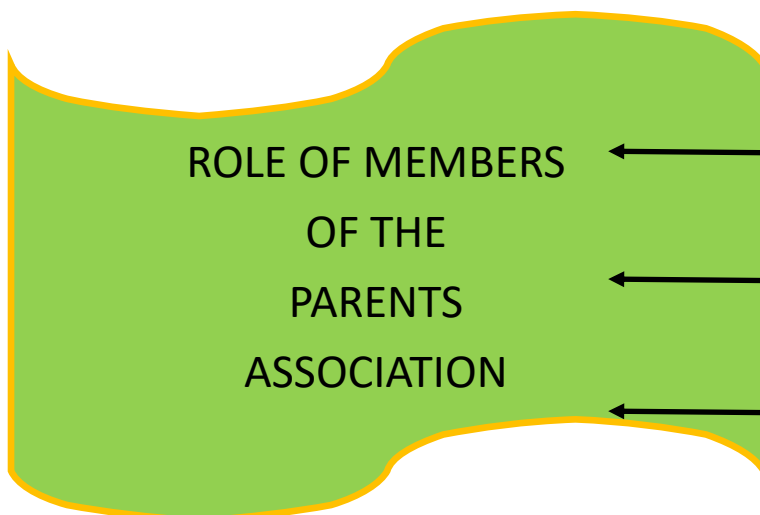
But we hope to be able to run some fundraisers for the school again very soon, all of which will be run in a safe manner and adhering to all Covid 19 compliant guidelines.

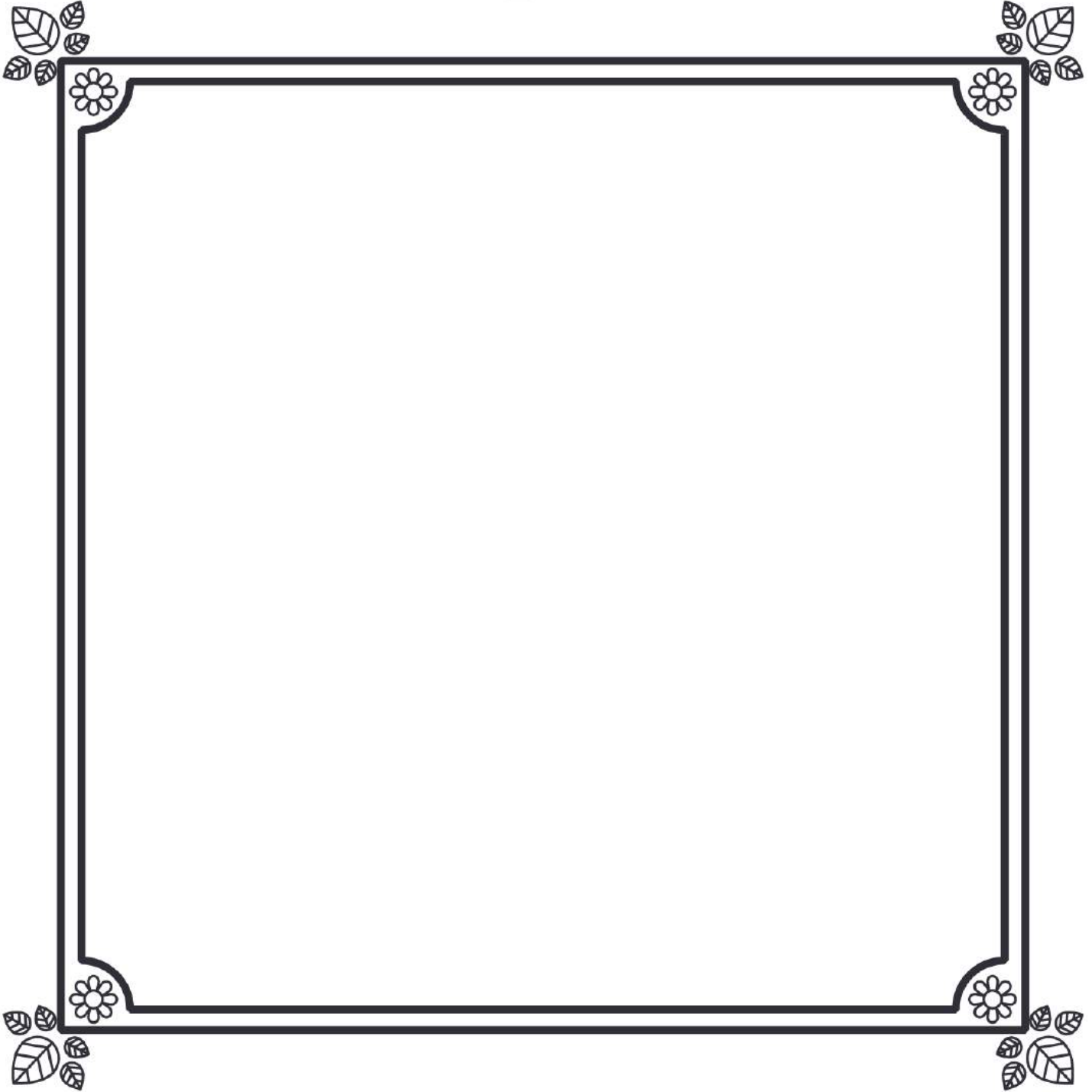
