Provision of First Aid:

On Yard: Teachers on yard will provide general first aid to children on yard

In Classrooms: Classroom teachers will provide first aid to children in their class in the first instance but may call on the principal or secretary where necessary.

Accident/Injury Form: Where a child has sustained an injury of any kind to any part of the head, or a more serious injury to any other part of the body (eg an injury with more than superficial bleeding/abrasion, a bad bruise, or swelling) it is school policy that the teacher dealing with the injury must fill in an accident/incident report using the google form set up for the purpose.

Contacting parents: In the event of any injury to the head, or any injury for which an incident/accident form is filled out, parents will be contacted with this information even if the injury is superficial and the child does not need to be collected.

More Serious illness/Injuries:

If a child is seriously ill or injured, parents will be called.

If the principal/deputy principal deems necessary a doctor may be called to the school from Windmill Medical Centre.

If necessary/ on the advice of a doctor, the principal or deputy principal will also call an ambulance, or may transport the child to the nearest pediatric accident and emergency department (Temple St. Children's Hospital)

Staff illness/injury:

If the person is able to travel home, they will do so. If they are not able to drive themselves one of the following will apply, depending on circumstances/severity of the illness/injury:

- Spouse/family member called to collect the staff member
- Principal or Deputy Principal drives the staff member home or to A&E
- Doctor consulted from Windmill Medical Centre

- Ambulance called and staff member accompanied into A&E.

In all cases except where the injured/ill person travels home, the staff member's nominated family contact is informed.
